Greetings on this Fourth Sunday of Easter
Dear brothers and sisters,
 This Sunday is also Good Shepherd Sunday and the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.
 In today's Gospel, Jesus said: **"I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep"** (John 10:11) The Good Shepherd has already done this for us, dying on the cross so that we may have eternal life. We are also called to remind that our Shepherd is with us—in our loneliness, sorrow, or trials as well as in our joy. Today or this week, please spend a few minutes in quiet, imagining yourself with the Good Shepherd in a green pasture or reflect upon the pray of *Saint Patrick:*

**"Christ with me,
 Christ before me,
 Christ behind me,
 Christ in me,
 Christ beneath me,
 Christ above me,
 Christ on my right,
 Christ on my left,
 Christ when I lie down,
 Christ when I sit down,
 Christ when I arise,
 Christ in the heart of every man
 who thinks of me,
 Christ in the mouth of everyone
 who speaks of me,
 Christ in every eye that sees me,
 Christ in every ear that hears me."**

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion
 "As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. Since the Eucharist is "The source and summit of the Christian life." (*Lumen Gentium, #11*) We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour.
When should Catholics not receive the Eucharist?

A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all." [i]

- If you have a mortal sin on your soul. For example, some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the Church, being unmarried but living together, using pornography, or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. For more info on what constitutes a mortal sin, refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1857 - 1859.
- If you have not observed the Eucharistic fast of one hour before receiving.
- If you have not yet received First Communion.
- If you do not believe the Eucharist to be Christ Himself (Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity).
